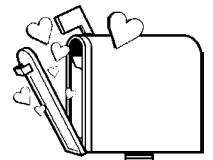

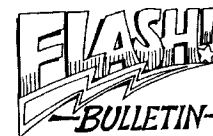

Rainbow Network provides school supplies for more than 8,000 primary school students every year. The list of materials needed to provide a quality education to these impoverished children is rather extensive. This year we've created a new and exciting way for people to provide school supplies – we've created an online wish list of the school supplies we'll be purchasing this year. The list works in conjunction with one of our suppliers. The result is that people can purchase supplies at wholesale prices and NPO will ship the supplies directly to Rainbow Network. All purchases from the wish list are credited as cash donations to Rainbow Network and are tax deductible as defined by law.

We are getting very positive feedback and response to this wish list so far. I think it is because people know exactly what their gift is being used for down to the specific items they choose to purchase and that 100% of the gift is going to purchasing those needed school supplies. Harvest on Wheels: We would like to thank the members of the church for all your contributions of fresh produce. Members and people in the neighborhood have brought fresh produce to the church for delivery to the Missouri Hotel/The Kitchen, Ozark Food Harvest, and Bill's Place. The total collected by members, neighborhood contributions, produce stands and farmers' markets by August 29 was 6,572 pound of fresh produce. This collection will continue through the end of October and into November depending upon the growing season.

Bill's Place: We are serving food prepared by members of our church each Tuesday of the month to the homeless at Bill's Place which offers social services affiliated with the Burrell Behavioral Health Services. The following members have volunteered: First Tuesday, Linda Bossi and Wanda Hedenberg; Second Tuesday, Susan Wheeler; and Third Tuesday: Kim Zimmerman and Nancy Davis. Another lady that is not a member volunteers on the fourth Tuesday. We need to find another person to cook food and help Susan on second Tuesdays of each month. Also, we need volunteers to help on the fifth Tuesday in September and any other months that have a fifth Tuesday. The following members have cooked and/or served: Shirley Griter, Kieth Wheeler, Joe Bossi, and Violet Bauer. If anyone can **contribute paper products such as plates, bowls, glasses and/or plastic silverware**, please leave it in the parlor or office closet and mark it for Bill's Place. The volunteers personally buy all such items and the food we serve. Thank you for all support.
